Setting and/or Surrounding Land Use: The farm is part of an original landholding of 200 acres of rolling land within the valley of Gabriel's Creek.

Historic Information: part of an early speculative development on Gabriel's Creek, owned by Gabriel Keith and John Allen in 1830s, who came from Philadelphia via Roanoke VA as land speculators. An original log house is on the property thought to have been built in 1855. Descendants include Lawrence Allen and James Keith, primary Confederate officers in the

infamous Shelton Laurel Massacre of 1863. Thomas Allen also served in the Confederate Army as a Lieutenant, was captured and held prisoner at the Point Lookout prison on the Maryland eastern shore.
