

Interview notes from Betty Reeves regarding other properties in Sandy Mush community: Oct 1, 2013

- Betty ~ a Clark man made brick on Sandy Mush which was used in the big house
- Betty's family were Flemings from Spring Creek. Her great grandfather was Van Brown who surveyed the road from Spring Creek to Hot Springs. He was a county commissioner in 1893, she was a County Commissioner in 1993, one hundred years later.
- Another barn to study is at 5849 Meadows Town Rd. property owned by Shirley Treadway.
- Worley Cove Rd barn- Joanne and Jack Sprinkles
- Glance family: owned half of Spring Creek and this side of Doggett Mt., and had the land at the base of the mountain. Malachiah Reeves married Glance's daughter.
- Reeves log barn across the highway- from two log houses put together, moved from the Glance property. Date carved on logs are 1828 and 1827.
- Malachiah Reeves house built in 1860.
- Ricky Reeves has the family history.
- Eric Wells- large dairy barn on NC 63 at Mad Co line; the family farm is remarkable clipped gable barn.
- NC 63- Archie Clarke barn- see daughter Cathy or son G.H.
- Clarke Branch - Venitha Reeves house and barns- was a flue cured barn; son is Kenneth Reeves- 683-3817
- Burnette Reeves road: dairy farm with roofed silos, gambrel roof at least 80 yrs old., Betty owns that property.
- Horoshak/Cooper farm – log base barn, low A roof, sheep farm.
- Tom and Virginia Roberts farm, Morrow Branch, has 3 unusual barns, unique underpass for cows
- Austin Branch: log base with steep A- roof. Joanne____, owner
