

John F. Payne Flue-cured Tobacco Barn

Conversation on site with Brian Roberts on Roy and Nell Payne barn/buildings:

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Log cabin was their residence until the house was built in July 1953

Brian's grandfather, Eugene Roberts, lived on Sugar Camp, moved to Snowbird Rd. across Bailey Branch Rd., walked all the way to Shoal Hill Church on Upper Paw Paw. He told Brian about bell-ringing at the churches, to alert neighbors to emergencies, births etc.

Hill above house is thought to have been Indian camp because of the numerous arrowheads found there.
